

PRCA Members:

The following is the Oklahoma State Veterinarian requirements for importing horses in the State of Oklahoma.

Attached are our import requirements. In addition to those due to the increase in Vesicular Stomatitis cases (we currently have confirmed cases in Osage, Washington, Craig, Ottawa, and Tulsa Counties) we have put some additional restrictions in place.

Any livestock (cattle, horses, swine, sheep, goats, camelids) coming from an affected County in Oklahoma must have a CVI written within 5 days with a statement that says, "All animals identified on this certificate of veterinary inspection have been examined and found to be free from signs of vesicular stomatitis and have not originated from a premise which is under quarantine for vesicular stomatitis."

Any livestock coming from an affected County in another state must have a CVI written within 5 days with a statement that says, "All animals identified on this certificate of veterinary inspection have been examined and found to be free from signs of vesicular stomatitis and have not originated from a premise which is under quarantine for vesicular stomatitis."

If the event is not in an affected County the livestock may go home the way they always have except some other States require a shortened CVI for livestock from an **entire** State if they have any quarantined premises. If the event is in an affected County all livestock should have a CVI from the event to go home.

I realize this is a lot more restrictive than normal but we are hoping to prevent the spread of the disease as much as possible. Please let me know if you have other questions.
